

Have you noticed some earthworks in the hills along the Cairns southern corridor? The Cairns Water Security Stage 1 (CWSS1) is underway. You can find out more about it at your local library. Pick up a project newsletter, grab an annotated map, or scan the QR code on the information poster to go straight to the website. Keep up-to-date with the biggest infrastructure project ever undertaken by Cairns Regional Council. Speaking of planning, the holiday season is just around the corner. All Cairns Library Branches will close for the holidays at 5pm on Tuesday 24th December, re-opening at 9am on Thursday 2nd January. Keep reading over the holiday break with up to 30 loan items available on your library card! Of course our eResources don't take a break; you can access them 24/7 all year long. Ask your friendly library staff for help if you don't know how.

Engage your brain at Cairns Libraries this December with two stimulating events. Meet Dr Valerie Keenan at Stratford Library to explore the rich cultural history of human interactions with the spectacular tropical landscape of the Herbert Gorge Region. Valerie is a Tully-based artist, curator, historian, and the author of Drawing You In – Carl Lumholtz in the Herbert. View original ink drawings, landscape photographs, and learn about this fascinating creative, historical, scientific, environmental and cultural research project. You can meet Valerie on Monday 2nd December, 10.30am at Stratford Library.

Then visit Smithfield Library to meet local artists Garth Murgha and Estelle Tranby. Collectively working as Native Creations Australia, Garth and Estelle will share their passion for cultural storytelling and identity through contemporary arts practice. Their vibrant works have featured in numerous exhibitions, most recently the prestigious Cairns Indigenous Art Fair (CIAF). Enjoy the works on display at brary while you share cultural storytelling with Garth and Estelle, Wednesday 4th December, 10.30am at Smithfield Library.
